

Our campaign needs to Listen and Learn

We will be hosting webinars on August 22 and August 24, both at 11 AM PDT.

Will you participate in one or both of these webinars? We benefit from your participation because we believe that our campaign can only craft the best, most effective solutions when they are enhanced by your experience.

On our [first Community Needs Assessment webinar](#), held on August 12, participating community members gave us the following feedback, based on their individual experiences, regarding our plan to Keep Teachers Teaching:

1. How will your plan help teachers? Teachers are the most important in imparting education to the future leaders of this country, and they have been struggling for a long time - they need to know that there is something new that can give them hope.
2. Online teaching is not easy, and transitioning to online teaching will be a challenge for many teachers. What resources will your plan provide to the teachers to help them through this process?
3. What can we do to address parents' concerns about being able to trust aides and monitors, who may not necessarily be certified teachers?

As a direct result of the feedback we received in our first webinar, we made the following improvements to our plan and the Community Needs Assessment Questionnaire:

1. Segmenting the questions in the Community Needs Assessment by stakeholder (i.e. teachers, administrators, parents/students)
2. Funding specifically for training for teachers and virtual classroom monitors on best practices for remote classroom management
3. Funding for tools and materials that teachers and classroom coordinators need to implement remote learning

We have included presentation summaries of the previous version of our plan and the current version of our plan so that each of you can compare and understand the changes we have made to account for the perspectives shared with us in the first webinar.
